

A 7-Day Anniversary Reading Pack

For a married couple marking an anniversary, at any number of years.

Heartfelt KJV scriptures to celebrate wedding anniversaries, renew vows, and honor lasting love.

How to use this pack

- Read a page each evening in the week leading up to the date.
- Use the prompts as conversation, not homework.
- Finish on the anniversary itself with the closing prayer read aloud.

The seven days

Day 1 — Remembering the vow · 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

Day 2 — Thanksgiving for the years · Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Day 3 — The hard seasons · Proverbs 5:18-19

Day 4 — Kindness renewed · Song of Solomon 2:16

Day 5 — Forgiveness kept short · Colossians 3:14

Day 6 — Serving together · 1 Peter 4:8

Day 7 — The years ahead · Ephesians 4:2-3

A wedding anniversary is a beautiful opportunity to reflect on the faithfulness of God in sustaining a marriage. Whether you are celebrating your first year or your fiftieth, these King James Bible verses speak to the enduring nature of love, the value of commitment, and the blessings that come from walking together with the Lord. Use them in anniversary cards, renewal of vows ceremonies, or as a devotional reading with your spouse.

Remembering the vow

Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.

The enduring definition of love

Devotion prompt

Read your original vows if you still have them. Which promise have you kept best, and which one has quietly slipped?

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Thanksgiving for the years

Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour. For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up.

The blessing of partnership through the years

Devotion prompt

List three specific mercies from this past year of marriage — not general blessings, but things that actually happened.

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

The hard seasons

Let thy fountain be blessed: and rejoice with the wife of thy youth. Let her be as the loving hind and pleasant roe; let her breasts satisfy thee at all times; and be thou ravished always with her love.

Rejoicing in lifelong love

Devotion prompt

What was the hardest stretch you came through together, and what did God do in it that you could not see at the time?

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Kindness renewed

My beloved is mine, and I am his: he feedeth among the lilies.

Song of Solomon 2:16 (KJV)

Belonging to one another

Devotion prompt

Kindness erodes quietly. Name one small courtesy you used to offer each other and have stopped. Start it again tomorrow.

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Forgiveness kept short

And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness.

Colossians 3:14 (KJV)

Love as the perfect bond

Devotion prompt

Is there anything from this year still unsettled between you? Say it plainly today rather than carrying it into the next year.

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Serving together

And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

Fervent love through the years

Devotion prompt

What has your marriage given away — hospitality, help, prayer? Choose one act of service to do together before the next anniversary.

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Devotion prompt

Write one sentence you want to be able to say about your marriage on the next anniversary. Then decide what habit gets you there.
