For a newly engaged couple in the months before the wedding.

Romantic and faith-filled KJV scriptures for engagement announcements, cards, and celebrations.

How to use this pack

- Read one page a week if the engagement is long, one a day if it is short.
- Answer the prompts separately first, then compare what you wrote.
- Keep the pack — it makes an honest anniversary read a year later.

Day 3 — Patience in waiting · 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

Day 7 — A house the Lord builds · Genesis 2:18

These King James Bible verses celebrate the love between two people, the faithfulness of God in bringing them together, and the promise of what lies ahead. Use these scriptures on engagement announcements, congratulations cards, social media posts, and in your prayers for the couple as they prepare for their wedding day.

Finding the one your soul loves

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Building on rock

Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour. For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up.

The strength of two together

Devotion prompt

What is the foundation of this relationship — attraction, shared history, or shared faith? Answer honestly, then talk about what needs strengthening.

Devotion prompt

Engagement is a season of waiting. What does the waiting reveal about how each of you handles delay and disappointment?

Devotion prompt

Write a one-sentence description of the home you want in ten years. What has to start now for that sentence to come true?
