

A 7-Day Reading Pack After Miscarriage or Infant Loss

For parents after a miscarriage, stillbirth, or the loss of a newborn.

Tender KJV scriptures offering comfort and hope for parents grieving miscarriage, stillbirth, or infant loss.

How to use this pack

- One page whenever you have the strength. There is no timetable.
- Fathers grieve this too and are rarely asked; both of you should answer.
- Nothing here will tell you it was for a reason.

The seven days

Day 1 — A real loss · Psalm 34:18

Day 2 — Grief nobody saw · 2 Samuel 12:23

Day 3 — The body's grief · Psalm 139:13-16

Day 4 — Guilt · Matthew 18:10

Day 5 — Between the two of you · Isaiah 49:15-16

Day 6 — Held by God · Jeremiah 31:15-17

Day 7 — Remembering · Revelation 21:4

The loss of a child — whether through miscarriage, stillbirth, or infant death — is among the most profound sorrows a parent can face. In these moments of unimaginable grief, God's Word offers a shelter of comfort. These King James Bible verses remind us that God knows our children before they are born, that He is near to the brokenhearted, and that heaven holds what our arms cannot. You are not alone in your sorrow, and your child is known and loved by God.

A real loss

The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.

Psalm 34:18 (KJV)

God draws near to the brokenhearted

Devotion prompt

This was a child, not an event. Write what you had already imagined about their life.

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Grief nobody saw

But now he is dead, wherefore should I fast? can I bring him back again? I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me.

2 Samuel 12:23 (KJV)

David's hope of reunion with his child

Devotion prompt

Who does not know? Who treated it as minor? What do you wish they had said instead?

The body's grief

For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well. My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth. Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them.

Devotion prompt

What do you need from each other that you have not asked for?

Write your answer

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

Held by God

Thus saith the Lord; A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rahel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not. Thus saith the Lord; Refrain thy voice from weeping, and thine eyes from tears: for thy work shall be rewarded, saith the Lord; and they shall come again from the land of the enemy. And there is hope in thine end, saith the Lord.

God promises hope after weeping

Devotion prompt

Remembering

And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away.

A future without tears

Devotion prompt

Choose a way to mark this child — a name, a date, a tree, a candle. Grief needs somewhere to go.

Pray it back to God before you close the page.

A prayer for this season

Father, we entrust our child to you. Be gentle with us, keep us close to each other, and let us grieve without shame. Amen.

Practical ways to use these verses

- 2 Samuel 12:23 offers hope of reunion and is deeply comforting for grieving parents
- Psalm 139:13-16 affirms that God knew and loved the child from conception
- Use Psalm 34:18 or Psalm 147:3 for sympathy cards after a pregnancy loss
- Isaiah 49:15-16 reassures parents that God has not forgotten their child
- Jeremiah 31:15-17 acknowledges the depth of grief while pointing to hope
- Share these verses gently — sometimes simply being present is the greatest comfort
