Answer Key & Explanations

Q1. To whom is the third epistle of John specifically addressed?

Answer: C. Gaius

The elder writes 'unto the wellbeloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth.' (3 John 1:1, KJV)

Q2. What does the author wish for Gaius above all things?

Answer: B. That he may prosper and be in health

John wishes that Gaius may prosper and be in health, even as his soul prospereth. (3 John 1:2, KJV)

Q3. What caused the author to rejoice greatly when the brethren came?

Answer: C. They testified of the truth that was in Gaius

John rejoiced when brethren testified of the truth that was in Gaius. (3 John 1:3, KJV)

Q4. John states he has no greater joy than to hear that his children do what?

Answer: B. Walk in truth

John writes, 'I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.' (3 John 1:4, KJV)

Q5. According to the text, how does Gaius deal with the brethren and strangers?

Answer: B. Faithfully

The elder commends Gaius, saying 'thou doest faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers.' (3 John 1:5, KJV)

Q6. For whose sake did the brethren go forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles?

Answer: C. For his name's sake

They went forth 'for his name's sake,' refusing support from the Gentiles. (3 John 1:7, KJV)

Q7. Who is described as loving to have the preeminence among the church members?

Answer: B. Diotrephes

Diotrephes is rebuked because he 'loveth to have the preeminence among them.' (3 John 1:9, KJV)

Q8. What does Diotrephes do to those who wish to receive the brethren?

Answer: B. He forbids them and casts them out of the church

He not only refuses the brethren but 'forbiddeth them that would, and casteth them out of the church.' (3 John 1:10, KJV)

Q9. Who has a 'good report of all men, and of the truth itself'?

Answer: C. Demetrius

Demetrius is commended for having a good report of all men. (3 John 1:12, KJV)

Q10. Why did the author not want to write more with ink and pen?

Answer: C. He trusted to see Gaius shortly and speak face to face

John preferred to speak 'face to face' rather than continue writing with pen and ink. (3 John 1:13, KJV)
