Q2. What was Agabus' first recorded prophecy?

And there stood up one of them named Agabus, and signified by the Spirit that there should be great dearth throughout all the world. (Acts 11:28) (Acts 11:28, KJV)

Q3. In whose reign did the famine come to pass?

...which came to pass in the days of Claudius Caesar. (Acts 11:28) (Acts 11:28, KJV)

Q4. What did the disciples determine to do because of the prophecy?

Q10. What did the brethren say when Paul would not be persuaded?

And when he would not be persuaded, we ceased, saying, The will of the Lord be done. (Acts 21:14) (Acts 21:14, KJV)
