## Answer Key & Explanations

**Q1. How is the suffering servant described as he grew up?**

**Answer: A. As a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground**

For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground. (Isaiah 53:2) (Isaiah 53:2, KJV)

**Q2. What was there no beauty in him that we should desire?**

**Answer: A. No form nor comeliness**

He hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. (Isaiah 53:2) (Isaiah 53:2, KJV)

**Q3. How was he treated by men?**

**Answer: A. Despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief**

He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief. (Isaiah 53:3) (Isaiah 53:3, KJV)

**Q4. What did we esteem him to be stricken with?**

**Answer: A. Smitten of God, and afflicted**

Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. (Isaiah 53:4) (Isaiah 53:4, KJV)

**Q5. For what was he wounded and bruised?**

**Answer: A. Our transgressions and iniquities**

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. (Isaiah 53:5) (Isaiah 53:5, KJV)

**Q6. What have we all done like sheep?**

**Answer: A. Gone astray; turned every one to his own way**

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. (Isaiah 53:6) (Isaiah 53:6, KJV)

**Q7. How did he open not his mouth?**

**Answer: A. As a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb**

He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. (Isaiah 53:7) (Isaiah 53:7, KJV)

**Q8. From what was he cut off?**

**Answer: A. The land of the living**

He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. (Isaiah 53:8) (Isaiah 53:8, KJV)

**Q9. Where was his grave made?**

**Answer: A. With the wicked, and with the rich in his death**

And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. (Isaiah 53:9) (Isaiah 53:9, KJV)

**Q10.** What does the LORD's pleasure in verse 10 concern?

**Answer:** A. To bruise him; he hath put him to grief for an offering for sin

Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. (Isaiah 53:10) (Isaiah 53:10, KJV)
