Q1. How many verses does Psalm 119 contain?

Answer: B. 176

Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible, containing 176 verses arranged as an acrostic of the Hebrew alphabet. (Psalm 119) (Psalms 119:1, KJV)

Q2. What does the psalmist say blessed are those who do?

Answer: A. Keep his testimonies, and that seek him with the whole heart

Blessed are they that keep his testimonies, and that seek him with the whole heart. (Psalm 119:2) (Psalms 119:2, KJV)

Q3. What does the psalmist ask to be kept from in verse 11?

Answer: A. Sinning against God by hiding God's word in his heart

Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee. (Psalm 119:11) (Psalms 119:11, KJV)

Q4. How does the psalmist describe himself in verse 25?

Answer: A. Dust: quicken thou me according to thy word

My soul cleaveth unto the dust: quicken thou me according to thy word. (Psalm 119:25) (Psalms 119:25, KJV)

Q5. What does the psalmist compare himself to in verse 83?

Answer: A. A bottle in the smoke

For I am become like a bottle in the smoke; yet do I not forget thy statutes. (Psalm 119:83) (Psalms 119:83, KJV)

Q6. What does the psalmist say God's word is in verse 105?

Answer: A. A lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path

Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path. (Psalm 119:105) (Psalms 119:105, KJV)

Q7. What does the psalmist love above gold in verse 127?

Answer: A. Thy commandments

Therefore I love thy commandments above gold; yea, above fine gold. (Psalm 119:127) (Psalms 119:127, KJV)

Q8. What does the psalmist open his mouth to do in verse 131?

Answer: A. Pant for God's commandments

I opened my mouth, and panted: for I longed for thy commandments. (Psalm 119:131) (Psalms 119:131, KJV)

Q9. What are God's testimonies described as in verse 138?

Answer: A. Righteous and very faithful

Thy testimonies that thou hast commanded are righteous and very faithful. (Psalm 119:138) (Psalms 119:138, KJV)

Q10. What does the psalmist say God's word is in verse 160?

Answer: A. True from the beginning

Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever. (Psalm 119:160) (Psalms 119:160, KJV)
