Answer Key & Explanations

Q1. In the opening of the book, what does the prophet cry out because of the violence he sees?

Answer: A. O LORD, how long shall I cry?

Habakkuk begins by lamenting that he cries out of violence and the Lord will not save. (Habakkuk 1:2, KJV)

Q2. Which nation did the LORD say He would raise up to execute judgment?

Answer: B. The Chaldeans

The LORD describes them as a bitter and hasty nation. (Habakkuk 1:6, KJV)

Q3. How does the LORD describe the eyes of the Holy One of Israel?

Answer: C. Of purer eyes than to behold evil

Habakkuk acknowledges that God is of purer eyes than to behold evil and cannot look on iniquity. (Habakkuk 1:13, KJV)

Q4. Where did Habakkuk say he would stand to watch and see what the LORD would say?

Answer: C. Upon my watch

The prophet set himself upon the tower to watch for the LORD's answer. (Habakkuk 2:1, KJV)

Q5. What instruction did the LORD give Habakkuk regarding the vision?

Answer: B. Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables

The vision was to be made plain so that he may run that readeth it. (Habakkuk 2:2, KJV)

Q6. According to Habakkuk 2:4, how shall the just live?

Answer: B. By his faith

This famous verse declares that 'the just shall live by his faith.' (Habakkuk 2:4, KJV)

Q7. With what shall the earth be filled, as the waters cover the sea?

Answer: B. The knowledge of the glory of the LORD

The scripture promises the earth will be filled with the knowledge of His glory. (Habakkuk 2:14, KJV)

Q8. Where is the LORD, such that all the earth should keep silence before Him?

Answer: B. In his holy temple

Habakkuk 2:20 states, 'But the LORD is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him.' (Habakkuk 2:20, KJV)

Q9. In his prayer, what does Habakkuk ask the LORD to remember in the midst of wrath?

Answer: B. Mercy

The prophet prays, 'in wrath remember mercy.' (Habakkuk 3:2, KJV)

Q10. Even if the fig tree shall not blossom, in whom will Habakkuk rejoice?

Answer: A. The God of my salvation

Habakkuk concludes with a song of trust, rejoicing in the God of his salvation. (Habakkuk 3:18, KJV)
