Q1. Out of what location did the LORD speak unto Moses at the beginning of the book?

Answer: B. The tabernacle of the congregation

The Lord called unto Moses out of the tabernacle of the congregation. (Leviticus 1:1, KJV)

Q2. Which of these was NOT permitted to be burnt in any offering of the LORD made by fire?

Answer: D. Leaven

No meat offering shall be made with leaven, nor any honey. (Leviticus 2:11, KJV)

Q3. What were the names of the two sons of Aaron who died for offering strange fire before the LORD?

Answer: C. Nadab and Abihu

Nadab and Abihu offered strange fire and died before the LORD. (Leviticus 10:1, KJV)

Q4. According to the law of clean and unclean beasts, what two features must a land animal have to be eaten?

Answer: B. Parteth the hoof and cheweth the cud

Whatsoever parteth the hoof, and is clovenfooted, and cheweth the cud, that shall ye eat. (Leviticus 11:3, KJV)

Q5. On the Day of Atonement, what was done with the 'scapegoat'?

Answer: C. It was let go into the wilderness

The goat shall be let go for a scapegoat into the wilderness. (Leviticus 16:10, KJV)

Q6. What is the people of Israel strictly forbidden from eating, because it is the life of all flesh?

Answer: B. Blood

For the life of all flesh is the blood thereof. (Leviticus 17:14, KJV)

Q7. Which famous commandment is found in Leviticus 19:18?

Answer: C. Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself

The law commands: thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. (Leviticus 19:18, KJV)

Q8. How many days was a lamp to burn continually in the tabernacle?

Answer: B. Always (continually)

Aaron was commanded to cause the lamps to burn continually. (Leviticus 24:2, KJV)

Q9. What was the fiftieth year called, in which liberty was proclaimed throughout all the land?

Answer: A. The Year of Jubilee

And ye shall hallow the fiftieth year... it shall be a jubile unto you. (Leviticus 25:10, KJV)

Q10. What was the penalty for a man who blasphemed the name of the LORD?

Answer: C. He was surely put to death by stoning

He that blasphemeth the name of the LORD, he shall surely be put to death. (Leviticus 24:16, KJV)
