Q1. The book of Nahum is described in the first verse as the burden of which city?

Answer: B. Nineveh

The opening verse identifies the prophecy as 'The burden of Nineveh.' (Nahum 1:1, KJV)

Q2. How is the Lord described in His relationship to His adversaries?

Answer: B. The Lord reserveth wrath for his enemies

Nahum 1:2 states that 'the Lord reserveth wrath for his enemies.' (Nahum 1:2, KJV)

Q3. According to Nahum 1:3, where does the Lord have His way?

Answer: A. In the whirlwind and in the storm

The scripture says, 'the Lord hath his way in the whirlwind and in the storm.' (Nahum 1:3, KJV)

Q4. What are the clouds described as being in relation to the Lord's feet?

Answer: B. The dust of his feet

Nahum 1:3 declares that 'the clouds are the dust of his feet.' (Nahum 1:3, KJV)

Q5. The Lord is described as a stronghold in what specific time?

Answer: C. The day of trouble

Nahum 1:7 says, 'The Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble.' (Nahum 1:7, KJV)

Nahum 1:15 asks us to behold 'the feet of him that bringeth good tidings.' (Nahum 1:15, KJV)

Nahum 2:3 states, 'The shield of his mighty men is made red.' (Nahum 2:3, KJV)

Q8. Nineveh is compared to a pool of what in chapter 2?

Nahum 2:8 says, 'But Nineveh is of old like a pool of water.' (Nahum 2:8, KJV)

Q9. Why is Nineveh called 'the bloody city' in chapter 3?

Answer: A. Because it is full of lies and robbery

Nahum 3:1 cries woe to the city that is 'all full of lies and robbery.' (Nahum 3:1, KJV)

Q10. Which populous city, mentioned in chapter 3, was already carried away into captivity?

Answer: A. No

Nahum 3:8 mentions 'populous No' (Thebes) as an example of a fallen city. (Nahum 3:8, KJV)
