Q1. How many pieces of silver did the woman have?

Answer: A. Ten

Either what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece. (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q2. What does she do when one is lost?

Answer: A. Light a candle, sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it

Doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it? (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q3. What does she do when she finds it?

Answer: A. Call her friends and neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me

And when she hath found it, she calleth her friends and her neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost. (Luke 15:9) (Luke 15:9, KJV)

Q4. What is there in the presence of the angels of God?

Answer: A. Joy over one sinner that repenteth

Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth. (Luke 15:10) (Luke 15:10, KJV)

Q5. What does the candle represent?

Answer: A. The light of God's word searching the dark places

The candle represents the illumination of God's word and Spirit, searching the dark places to find that which is lost. (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q6. What does the sweeping of the house represent?

Answer: A. The thorough work of the Spirit in cleaning and searching

The sweeping of the house represents the thorough searching and purifying work of the Holy Spirit. (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q7. What were these silver pieces likely used for?

Answer: A. They were part of a headdress worn by married women as a dowry or ornament

The ten pieces of silver likely represent a headdress worn by a married woman, consisting of ten coins linked together — losing one would mean the ornament was incomplete. (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q8. Who are the 'friends and neighbours' the woman calls?

Answer: A. The community of heaven rejoicing

The friends and neighbours represent the community of heaven — angels and saints — who rejoice when a lost soul is found. (Luke 15:9) (Luke 15:9, KJV)

Q9. How does this parable complement the Lost Sheep?

Answer: A. It shows the same truth from a different perspective — the diligent search and great joy

The Lost Sheep shows God's seeking love; the Lost Coin shows the Spirit's searching illumination — both ending in the same heavenly joy over repentance. (Luke 15:1-10) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

Q10. What does the woman's persistence teach us?

Answer: A. That the search for the lost is diligent and thorough until found

The woman's diligent search until she finds the coin teaches us the thoroughness and persistence with which God seeks the lost. (Luke 15:8) (Luke 15:8, KJV)

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
