Q1. To whom did Jesus speak this parable?

Answer: A. The publicans and sinners, and the Pharisees and scribes

Then drew near unto him all the publicans and sinners for to hear him. And the Pharisees and scribes murmured, saying, This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them. (Luke 15:1-2) (Luke 15:1, KJV)

Q2. How many sheep did the man have?

Answer: A. An hundred

What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them. (Luke 15:4) (Luke 15:4, KJV)

Q3. What does the shepherd do when one is lost?

Answer: A. Leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it

Doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it? (Luke 15:4) (Luke 15:4, KJV)

Q4. What does he do when he finds it?

Answer: A. Lay it on his shoulders, rejoicing

And when he hath found it, he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing. (Luke 15:5) (Luke 15:5, KJV)

Q5. Whom does he call together when he comes home?

Answer: A. His friends and neighbours

And when he cometh home, he calleth together his friends and neighbours, saying unto them, Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost. (Luke 15:6) (Luke 15:6, KJV)

Q6. What is there in heaven over one sinner that repenteth?

Answer: A. More joy than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance

I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance. (Luke 15:7) (Luke 15:7, KJV)

Q7. What does the shepherd represent?

Answer: A. God seeking the lost

The shepherd represents God the Father and Jesus Christ, who actively seek and save those who have wandered from the fold. (Luke 15:4-7) (Luke 15:4, KJV)

Q8. What does Matthew's version say about the sheep that went astray?

Answer: A. It went astray if it befall him to go astray, and he seeketh it

How think ye? if a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray? (Matthew 18:12) (Matthew 18:12, KJV)

Q9. What does Matthew 18:14 say is not the will of the Father?

Answer: A. That one of these little ones should perish

Even so it is not the will of your Father which is in heaven, that one of these little ones should perish. (Matthew 18:14) (Matthew 18:14, KJV)

Q10. What does the ninety and nine represent?

Answer: A. Those who are already in the fold

The ninety and nine represent those who are already safe in the fold, while the lost sheep represents the one who has wandered and needs to be sought and brought back. (Luke 15:4-7) (Luke 15:4, KJV)
