Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field. (Matthew 13:31) (Matthew 13:31, KJV)

Q2. How is the mustard seed described?

Answer: A. The least of all seeds

Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs. (Matthew 13:32) (Matthew 13:32, KJV)

Q3. What does the mustard seed become when grown?

Answer: A. The greatest among herbs, and a tree

But when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree. (Matthew 13:32) (Matthew 13:32, KJV)

Q4. What comes and lodges in the branches of the mustard tree?

Answer: A. The birds of the air

So that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof. (Matthew 13:32) (Matthew 13:32, KJV)

Q5. In Mark 4:31-32, where is the mustard seed sown?

If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. (Matthew 17:20) (Matthew 17:20, KJV)

The mustard seed illustrates that God's kingdom begins in small, hidden ways but grows to become a refuge for many. (Matthew 13:31-32) (Matthew 13:31, KJV)

Q10. Which birds lodge in the branches according to Luke's version?

It grew, and waxed a great tree; and the fowls of the air lodged in the branches of it. (Luke 13:19) (Luke 13:19, KJV)
