## Answer Key & Explanations

**Q1. Who invited Jesus to eat with him?**

**Answer: A. A Pharisee named Simon**

And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat. And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner... (Luke 7:36-37) (Luke 7:36, KJV)

**Q2. What did the sinful woman do when she came to Jesus?**

**Answer: B. She washed His feet with tears and anointed them with ointment**

And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment. (Luke 7:38) (Luke 7:38, KJV)

**Q3. What did Simon the Pharisee think to himself?**

**Answer: B. If this man were a prophet, he would have known what manner of woman this is**

Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner. (Luke 7:39) (Luke 7:39, KJV)

**Q4. In the parable, how many debtors did the creditor have?**

**Answer: B. Two**

There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty. (Luke 7:41) (Luke 7:41, KJV)

**Q5. How much did one debtor owe?**

**Answer: C. Five hundred pence**

The one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty. (Luke 7:41) (Luke 7:41, KJV)

**Q6. How much did the other debtor owe?**

**Answer: B. Fifty pence**

The one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty. (Luke 7:41) (Luke 7:41, KJV)

**Q7. What did the creditor do when they had nothing to pay?**

**Answer: B. Forgave them both**

And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. (Luke 7:42) (Luke 7:42, KJV)

**Q8. Which one will love the creditor most?**

**Answer: B. The one who owed five hundred**

Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most? Simon answered and said, I suppose that he, to whom he forgave most. (Luke 7:42-43) (Luke 7:43, KJV)

**Q9. What did Jesus say to the woman at the end?**

**Answer: A. Your faith hath saved thee; go in peace**

And he said unto the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace. (Luke 7:50) (Luke 7:50, KJV)

**Q10. What is the main lesson of the parable?**

**Answer: B. Those forgiven much love much**

Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little. (Luke 7:47) (Luke 7:47, KJV)
