Q1. Who was Sisera's king?

Answer: A. Jabin king of Canaan

And the LORD sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, that reigned in Hazor; the captain of whose host was Sisera. (Judges 4:2) (Judges 4:2, KJV)

Q2. Where did Sisera dwell?

Answer: A. In Harosheth of the Gentiles

And the LORD sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, that reigned in Hazor; the captain of whose host was Sisera, which dwelt in Harosheth of the Gentiles. (Judges 4:2) (Judges 4:2, KJV)

Q3. How many iron chariots did Sisera have?

Answer: A. Nine hundred

And the children of Israel cried unto the LORD: for he had nine hundred chariots of iron; and twenty years he mightily oppressed the children of Israel. (Judges 4:3) (Judges 4:3, KJV)

Q4. How long did Sisera oppress Israel?

Answer: A. Twenty years

And twenty years he mightily oppressed the children of Israel. (Judges 4:3) (Judges 4:3, KJV)

Q5. Who was the prophetess that judged Israel during Sisera's oppression?

Answer: A. Deborah

And Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lapidoth, she judged Israel at that time. (Judges 4:4) (Judges 4:4, KJV)

Q6. What did Deborah tell Barak about Sisera?

Answer: A. The LORD shall sell Sisera into the hand of a woman

And I will draw unto thee to the river Kishon Sisera, the captain of Jabin's army, with his chariots and his multitude; and I will deliver him into thine hand. (Judges 4:7) (Judges 4:7, KJV)

Q7. How did the LORD discomfit Sisera and his chariots?

Answer: A. With the edge of the sword before Barak

And the LORD discomfited Sisera, and all his chariots, and all his host, with the edge of the sword before Barak. (Judges 4:15) (Judges 4:15, KJV)

Q8. What happened to Sisera's chariots?

Answer: A. Sisera lighted down off his chariot, and fled away on his feet

So that Sisera lighted down off his chariot, and fled away on his feet. (Judges 4:15) (Judges 4:15, KJV)

Q9. Where did Sisera flee after his defeat?

Answer: A. To the tent of Jael the wife of Heber the Kenite

Howbeit Sisera fled away on his feet to the tent of Jael the wife of Heber the Kenite: for there was peace between Jabin the king of Hazor and the house of Heber the Kenite. (Judges 4:17) (Judges 4:17, KJV)

Q10. How did Sisera die?

Answer: A. Jael drove a nail of the tent into his temples while he slept

Then Jael Heber's wife took a nail of the tent, and took an hammer in her hand, and went softly unto him, and smote the nail into his temples, and fastened it into the ground: for he was fast asleep and weary. So he died. (Judges 4:21) (Judges 4:21, KJV)
