Answer Key & Explanations

Q1. In the opening chapter, the bride describes herself as 'black, but comely' and compares herself to which tents?

Answer: A. The tents of Kedar

She says she is black like the tents of Kedar, but comely as the curtains of Solomon. (Song of Solomon 1:5, KJV)

Q2. To what flower does the bride compare herself in the second chapter?

Answer: B. The rose of Sharon

The speaker declares, 'I am the rose of Sharon, and the lily of the valleys.' (Song of Solomon 2:1, KJV)

Q3. What does the bridegroom say is 'sweet' and 'comely' in the second chapter?

Answer: A. Thy voice and thy countenance

He asks to see her countenance and hear her voice, for her voice is sweet. (Song of Solomon 2:14, KJV)

Q4. What 'little' animals are mentioned as spoiling the vines?

Answer: C. Little foxes

The text says, 'Take us the foxes, the little foxes, that spoil the vines.' (Song of Solomon 2:15, KJV)

Q5. The bridegroom compares the bride's hair to a flock of what animal?

Answer: A. Goats

He says her hair is as a flock of goats that appear from mount Gilead. (Song of Solomon 4:1, KJV)

Q6. What are the bride's lips compared to in chapter 4?

Answer: A. A thread of scarlet

The text states, 'Thy lips are like a thread of scarlet, and thy speech is comely.' (Song of Solomon 4:3, KJV)

Q7. The bridegroom describes the bride as a 'garden inclosed' and what other sealed object?

Answer: A. A spring shut up

He calls her 'a garden inclosed... a spring shut up, a fountain sealed.' (Song of Solomon 4:12, KJV)

Q8. When the bride seeks her beloved in the city at night, who finds and smites her?

Answer: A. The watchmen

The watchmen that went about the city found her, smote her, and wounded her. (Song of Solomon 5:7, KJV)

Q9. According to chapter 8, love is as strong as what?

Answer: A. Death

The scripture says, 'for love is strong as death; jealousy is cruel as the grave.' (Song of Solomon 8:6, KJV)

Q10. What can 'many waters' not do to love?

Answer: A. Quench it

The text declares, 'Many waters cannot quench love, neither can the floods drown it.' (Song of Solomon 8:7, KJV)
